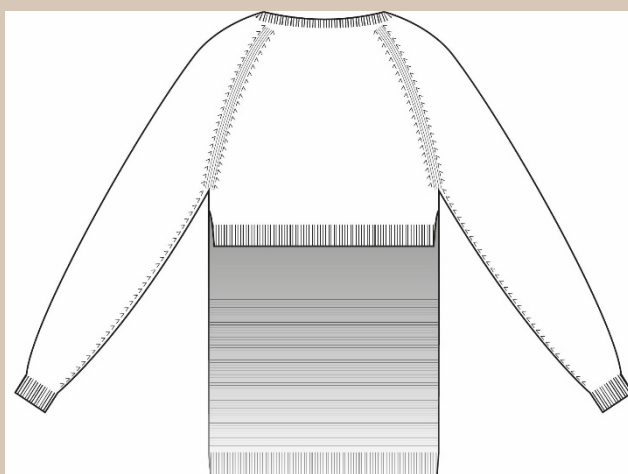
Technology

The RolliPulli is seamlessly manufactured in one piece on a flat knitting machine.



Product innovation

The development of a perfectly fitting (if necessary, customized) sweater with a very short back and a very long front that may widen towards the bottom.

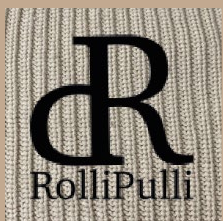


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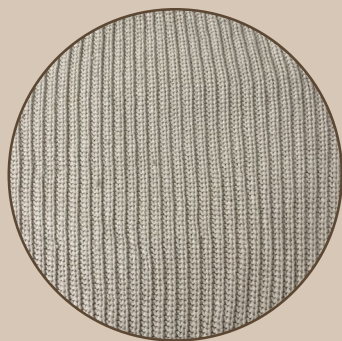


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Yarn

The RolliPulli is knitted from yarns that are made entirely, or at least partially, from European, ideally German, hemp.



Nursing aspect

The garment should be as easy as possible to put on and take off. The new design allows a single caregiver to put it on over the head from the front.

Physiology

Comfortable, pleasant, and stylish clothing boosts the wearer's self-confidence and sense of well-being. This is especially true for people who are confined to a wheelchair due to severe mobility limitations and/or who, due to cognitive impairments (e.g., senile dementia), are no longer able to perceive themselves or articulate their thoughts. People with severely limited mobility sit in wheelchairs for long periods of time without moving, which can cause pressure points at the seams and lead to the development of pressure sores.
